Gault Original are miniature ceramic houses made in France starting in the early 1980's. Jean-Pierre Gault is the artist who started it all and became a successful business through the investment and leadership of his brother Dominique. Collectors from around the world cherish the Gault Original houses.



Did You Know?

Gault ceramic houses are also known as Gault Limoges due to the clay used in the early days, which came from the town of Limoges, France.

The Gault Original ceramic houses started with the depiction of Provence houses in 1984 then quickly expanded to Paris houses. By 1990, several additional series came to life, such as London, Rome, Venice, Alsace, Amsterdam and San Francisco. Other smaller lines were also created, such as San Gimignano, Vienna, Main Street Disney, and more.



In the late 1990's a new line of houses branded as J Carlton came to life, which are smaller in scale compared to the Gault Original ceramic houses. There were initially two type of J Carlton houses; some were made of plaster and some were made of resin. The plaster houses were discontinued while the resin houses continue to this day. The Gault Original ceramics houses ceased to be produced in 2010 however in cooperation with the principal ceramic artist, Gault-France.com has been re-launched and features an online shop.
