When several houses of the same model needed to be produced, a device was used to create a long string of a house's shape, then cut into pieces for each house.

The Uniqueness of Gault Houses

While the process of creating new Gault Original ceramic houses continues, with the focus currently on the painting process based on today's available materials and products, we equally spend effort on stocking older pieces using pieces on hand and constantly scanning the globe for previously sold pieces that could make their way back to us.

Collectors of this miniature art are often surprised to find out that they own two pieces of the same model. In the world of Gault, a model is essentially the shape of the house. From there, all details like doors, windows, chimneys, name banners and more, are all different. This photos shows an obvious example of houses of the same model.



This landmark model of course always has the Fouquet's name as it is the artistic interpretation of the real establishment, but it is easy to see that all other architectural details are different.
