Jean-Pierre GAULT 1940-2020



It is with great sadness that we report the passing of Jean-Pierre GAULT on August 21, 2020. Architect and artist, Jean-Pierre was the creative genius that started the GAULT Original ceramic houses in the early 1980's. He will forever remain in our hearts, with a deep appreciation of his work and his life.

Jean-Pierre developed some revolutionary techniques for the creation of the first Provence ceramic houses, such as extruding sections, templates for slanted/cut-off corners, and roof-making devices. The first houses came out in 1983 made in Jean-Pierre's garage in Saint-Paul-de-Vence. He continued to refine aspects of the techniques and wall colors and realized a small but interesting success with tourists. In 1984, Dominique (Jean-Pierre's brother) financed for a small boutique at 41 rue Grande (also known at the time as 41 Place de la Grande Fontaine), the main road of Saint-Paul-de-Vence and a great journey began.
