Focus on San Francisco

The Gault Original houses in ceramic are most often associated with the architecture of houses in France, as the first two series were houses depicting architecture from the Provence region and the city of Paris.

From there, in the late 1980's and early 1990's it became apparent that people who appreciate architecture would also likely enjoy Gault houses depicting other regions or cities. As such, the offering of houses included other locations like London, Venice, Amsterdam and more.

One series however stood out as the only one depicting houses outside of Europe, and that is the San Francisco series.

There are several styles of houses in the city of San Francisco based on the era. Gault focused on the these 3 early types: Italianate, Stick, and Queen Anne.

These architecture styles are what most people associate San Francisco with, on the sloped streets with the trolley, as seen in many iconic movie scenes.

The photos on the right show some of the San Francisco Gault houses, which include side garages. It is a fun series, very different from the others!
