Did You Know?

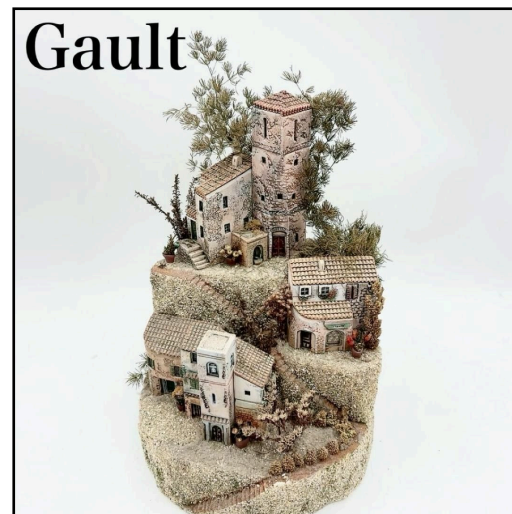
Like many things, Gault houses in long exposure to the sun will fade finish of the houses. It is best to keep them away from sunlight.



Creating a Gault Diorama

Displaying the Gault Original houses can be as simple as lining them up on a shelf to create a street scene, in fact most collectors of these miniature houses display them in that fashion.

Sometimes collectors prefer to create elevations or they use a display space that is more vertical than horizontal. This picture demonstrates an example of a vertical display with elevations.



Creating this scene might be simpler than imagined. One way to make such display is by cutting polystyrene foam layers of various sizes and gluing them together to create elevations. Craft glue (like Elmer's glue in USA) can be used for this. Stairs can also be cut in the foam using a knife or a hot wire foam cutting tool.

Then the same glue is brushed on the full piece and sand or other landscape material is applied. Model trees and bushes (like those used in model railroad displays) can be planted into the foam.

The last step is just to add your Gault houses to the piece!
