Collectors from around the world cherish the Gault Original houses.

Did You Know?

The Gault stores in France in the 1980's-2000's often displayed the houses on a mirror base and even sold mirrors with the imprinted Gault logo on one of the corners.



Display Ideas for Gault Houses

There are countless ways to display the Gault Original houses and some ideas have been presented in our past newsletters. In this issue we share two more ideas to showcase your pieces.

Decorative Narrow Shelf or False Mantle

A space-saving approach is to use a decorative narrow shelf or false mantle on a wall as shown in the first photo.

These are easy to install and in addition to consuming minimal space, they can be positioned at a desired height like at eye level. This makes it easier to enjoy the details of the scene compared to placing the houses on a table, looking at the scene from above or having to bend down to look at the details.



Mirror Base

Gault Collectors often use a rectangular mirror base on a table or shelf to display their Gault scene.

Using a mirror base for display elevates items by adding depth, reflection, and perceived space. It also makes the display more prominent and noticeable.



There is no right way or wrong way to display your Gault scene, the main idea is to enjoy your collection!
